

Wilkes-Barre Area Career and Technical Center Admissions Procedure 2018-2019

Students interested in attending Wilkes-Barre Area Career and Technical Center (WBACTC) must complete an application which is available at the Guidance Office of the sending district of the student beginning on February 1, 2018 through April 30, 2018 for all students in 8th grade who will participate in our Phoenix program or 9th graders looking to attend in grade 10. The application must be completed by the parent/guardian then submitted to the student's guidance counselor. The application deadline for the home school district to submit applications to WBACTC is May 1st. As a public school WBACTC accepts students year round and fills available seats on a first come first serve basis for sending districts (Wilkes-Barre Area, Pittston, Hanover Area, Nanticoke, and Crestwood Area) , then participating districts (Old Forge, Riverside), then all other districts according to the mandated state requirements for admission.

The Wilkes-Barre Area Career and Technical Center Guidance Department reviews and signs the application for approval. After May 1, 2018 students may still obtain an application through their home school district and have the ability to submit documentation until August 1st with the understanding that the procedures discussed above are followed.

Students are required to fill in three Programs of Study choices. Students are not guaranteed their first career choice as program selection is done on a first come first serve basis

Application Acceptance Procedure

Once applications are received by Wilkes-Barre Area Career and Technical Center, they will be submitted to Child Accounting, to be registered in the computer system. An acceptance letter will be sent welcoming the student for entry into a desired Program of Study.
